Community Presentation is a Huge Success by Mary McGinley

On January 16, a packed house at the Sayerville Library learned all about Tarot cards and how to use them from Toastmaster, Donna Juzva. The library staff was so pleased with the success of the program that they have invited Donna to speak again in March.

Using projections to magnify the card images, Donna explained the basic themes presented in the typical Tarot deck. Comparing different versions of the same cards, she drew the audience's attention to hidden meanings and motifs.

Donna Juzva, ACB, ALB has been a member of Toastmasters International since 2006. This year, in addition to being President of Somerset Toastmasters, she is serving as Area 34 Governor, in District 83. Donna credits her experience with Toastmasters, for helping to develop her skills to the point where she is now presenting programs and seminars such as this one.

**Why I Joined Toastmasters
(and Why I Stay)**

To be honest, I had not planned on joining Toastmasters. It happened by chance and I'm glad it did.

At one point in my career, I was given the opportunity to take any technology class I wanted, within budget of course. I approached a friend, a guru in his field, and asked for his suggestions regarding training possibilities. He had written several books and numerous articles and gave talks all over the world. I thought that he would surely recommend a class in his specialty, perhaps even a class that he taught. His advice surprised me. He said that the best course he had ever taken was the one in public speaking. In his experience, he encountered many excellent ideas that went no where because they were not presented well.

He also witnessed mediocre ideas that succeeded because they were presented well. He highly recommended that I take a course in public speaking! That's not the answer I wanted! I realized that I had forgotten to qualify my request with 'technical' training and pushed him for additional advice. Although I pursued the technical training, his recommendation that I take a course in public speaking nagged at me.

Several years later, when I heard that a Toastmasters chapter was starting in our company, I knew I had to muster up the courage to join.

I still remember my first speech. It was about nine months after joining the club and felt as painful as giving birth. I remember shaking like a leaf throughout my ice breaker and being extremely grateful that our "Wizard of Ahs" did not count above ten! I also remember the support I received and sought a mentor who helped me plan and prepare subsequent speeches.

Fast forward to today. I have my CTM and CL designations and recently gave the speech of my life at my father's memorial service. I knew my father would want us to celebrate his life rather than mourn his death. I also knew that I had to share stories that helped people laugh and remember the good times. It worked! My speech paved the way for others to get up and share their memories. We had a positive and uplifting celebration. It was one of the hardest things I've ever done and I know that the skills I acquired through Toastmasters helped me.

I remain in the club to continue to improve my speaking skills and to give back by helping others who are just starting out in the club.
